Did you know....

That at one time Dewart Lake was known as Lingle Lake? Named for Thomas and Matlene Lingle who were the first owners of the land back in 1837.

BE AWARE

There have been some reported thefts on our lake recently. In some areas gas lines have been cut and the gas cans stolen. It has also been reported that gas is being siphoned off, and some residents have lost equipment which was removed from their boats. So please be aware and watch your property and that of your neighbors.

Another issue that has been brought to my attention is that there are ski boats coming too close to piers. The Indiana Boating Laws state, "No person shall operate any motorboat so as to approach or pass within two hundred (200) feet of the shoreline of any lake or channel thereof at a rate of speed greater than ten (10) miles per hour...."

Skiing after sunset is also prohibited by Indiana Law. The law states, "No person shall operate any boat during the period between sunset and sunrise at a rate of speed greater than ten (10) miles per hour."

Invasive Plant Spotted on the Island

Purple Loosestrife has been spotted on the island. This is an invasive plant that needs to be eradicated. If you have this plant on your property, there are specific ways to kill it, and if not done properly, it can spread very rapidly.

1967-2017: 50 Years on the Lake

Paul and Sue Wilkinson, Lane 23, purchased their present home in 1967. They had been married for two years at the time and had 6-month-old twins. Paul had changed jobs from Wabash to Syracuse Rubber, hired as a chemist, and needed a house. A secretary there knew of a house on Dewart Lake that was for sale. This particular one had been built in 1955 and had been vacant for two years. Charlie and Linda Greene were here, and Linda still lives two houses away from the Wilkinson's.

By 1971 four homes, including Harper's Beach Bar, had burned down. Because the Milford Fire Dept. was far enough away, the people living in this immediate area got their own fire hose which could be dropped in the lake for the water needed to extinguish! The hose was kept at the home currently occupied by the Kirkham's.
